

Read Romans 12:1-13

For more information about Spiritual gifts see also 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 & Ephesians 4:7-13 and the two handouts ***Spiritual Gifts*** and ***Spiritual Gift Assessment***.

1. Why might Paul use the imagery of *living sacrifices* (v1) to describe our proper response to God's mercy?
2. How would the kind of love Paul talks about in verses 9-13 transform our relationships with other Christians?

God gives gifts and he may also take them away. The gifting we have today may be different to the gifting (or the opportunities to use that gifting) of years ago.
3. As you think *with sober judgment* (v3) about yourself, what Spiritual gift (or gifts) do you think God has given you?
4. If you are a part of the body of Christ with gifts necessary for the healthy functioning of that body, how are you using your gifts? What area of ministry (let's not talk about 'jobs!') are you using your gifts in or would like to use your gifts in... even if stepping up to do that may be a bit scary at first!?
